

Job Description

Key Stage 2 Class Teacher

Responsible to: Head Teacher, Deputy Head Teacher and Phase Leader

To carry out the professional duties of a class teacher and maintain high standards of teaching and learning, marking, monitoring and assessment and communication with parents/carers.

Main purpose of the job:

The purpose of the job of Class Teacher is to:

- maintain and contribute to the ethos of the school;
- teach pupils in accordance with the curriculum;
- be deployed as a teacher across the school if required;
- ensure that each pupil achieves his or her fullest potential;
- carry out the professional duties of a teacher, all under the direction of the Head Teacher;
- accept reasonable additional responsibilities as assigned by the Head Teacher
- take part in school events and extra-curricular activities; and
- take part in the schools agreed performance management process.

Main duties and activities:

The job holder will:

- be an effective, good class teacher providing for the range of needs of the children within the class;
- plan to deliver the curriculum within the framework of present school policies, both in short and long term planning structures;
- have the highest expectation of every child, believing that every learner has an unlimited potential for development;
- keep detailed records of the progress of each child in the class in line with school policy
- plan and resource the classroom as appropriate to encourage the development of all aspects of children's learning. In particular to encourage children towards the independent use of resources and involvement in their learning;
- assess and monitor the progress of each child in the class, keeping records and evaluating the children's achievements to ensure all pupils make expected or better progress;
- set children high standards in the content and presentation of their work by the quality of displays of work;
- establish and maintain good relationships with colleagues, working as part of the team in all aspects of school development in a professional manner;
- implement equal opportunities in all aspects of school life;
- work in partnership with parents/carers in providing a quality education experience for all of the children;
- accept additional responsibilities in respect of organising and supervising extra-curricular clubs;
- be responsible for a curriculum area; and
- be responsible for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young persons who you are responsible for, or come in contact with.
